ABOUT SEMINOLE



Seminole Electric Cooperative (Seminole) is one of the largest generation and transmission (G&T) cooperatives in the country. Seminole provides reliable, competitively-priced, wholesale electric power to nine Member distribution electric cooperatives.

Approximately two million people and businesses in 42 Florida counties rely on electricity provided by Seminole and delivered by nine Member distribution cooperatives. Seminole also owns, operates, and maintains more than 350 miles of transmission line.

Collectively, Seminole Member distribution lines reach less than 10 customers per mile on average – although this number varies considerably across the state depending on growth and location.

Seminole works to maintain a balanced and diversified generation portfolio that includes owned generation, as well as capacity and energy provided through purchased power agreements with other utilities, independent power producers, and government entities (e.g. municipals and counties). Seminole also receives power from renewable energy facilities, including waste-to-energy, landfill gas-to-energy, and a biomass facility*.

The diversity in Seminole's generation mix reduces exposure to changing market conditions, helping keep rates competitive.

**Seminole Electric Cooperative may sell a portion of the renewable energy credits associated with its renewable generation to third parties. The third parties can use the credits to meet mandatory or voluntary renewable requirements.*

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Seminole Electric Cooperative has a 27-Member Board of Trustees (Board), consisting of two voting members and one alternate member from each of the nine Member distribution cooperatives. The managers of each Member cooperative are voting members. The second voting member and the alternate are members of their distribution cooperative board.

The Board is responsible for setting and executing policies through the following committees: Administrative; Finance and Audit; Executive; Rates and Member Relations; and Power Supply. Each committee is comprised of one Board trustee from each Member distribution cooperative. The Rates and Member Relations committee is comprised of the manager trustee from each Member cooperative.

The Executive committee consists of the Board officers, two at-large trustees, the immediate past Board president, and the current Board president, and functions to make recommendations related to legal and executive management issues.

PRIMARY GENERATION RESOURCES



SEMINOLE GENERATING STATION

The Seminole Generating Station (SGS) consists of one 714-megawatt, coal-fired generating unit. The facility is in Putnam County, near the St. John's River, south of Jacksonville.

Seminole has invested more than \$530 million in state-of-the-art environmental control technology at SGS, making it one of the cleanest coal plants in the United States.



SEMINOLE COMBINED CYCLE FACILITY

The Seminole Combined Cycle Facility is located directly adjacent to the existing Seminole Generating Station site in Putnam County, Florida, and has a generating capacity of 1,183 megawatts.



MIDULLA GENERATING STATION

The Midulla Generating Station (MGS), located on the Hardee/Polk County line, uses natural gas as its primary fuel. The station's more than 624-megawatt combined-cycle unit began commercial operation in 2002. Seminole added 314 megawatts of peaking capacity in 2006. MGS also utilizes ultra-low sulfur fuel oil as a backup fuel.

SEMINOLE'S SOLAR RESOURCES



COOPERATIVE SOLAR

Seminole operates a 2.2-Megawatt Cooperative Solar facility located in Hardee County, Florida adjacent to the Midulla Generating Station.



SEMINOLE CONTRACTED SOLAR

In 2024, four solar sites came online and reached commercial operation. These sites are under power purchase agreements (PPAs) that are now a part of Seminole's generation portfolio.

These sites contribute about 298 megawatts (MWs) of solar capacity collectively. The sites are distributed across Member service territory and are referred to as: Columbia County Solar, Gadsden County Solar, Gilchrist County, and Tupelo Solar in Putnam County.

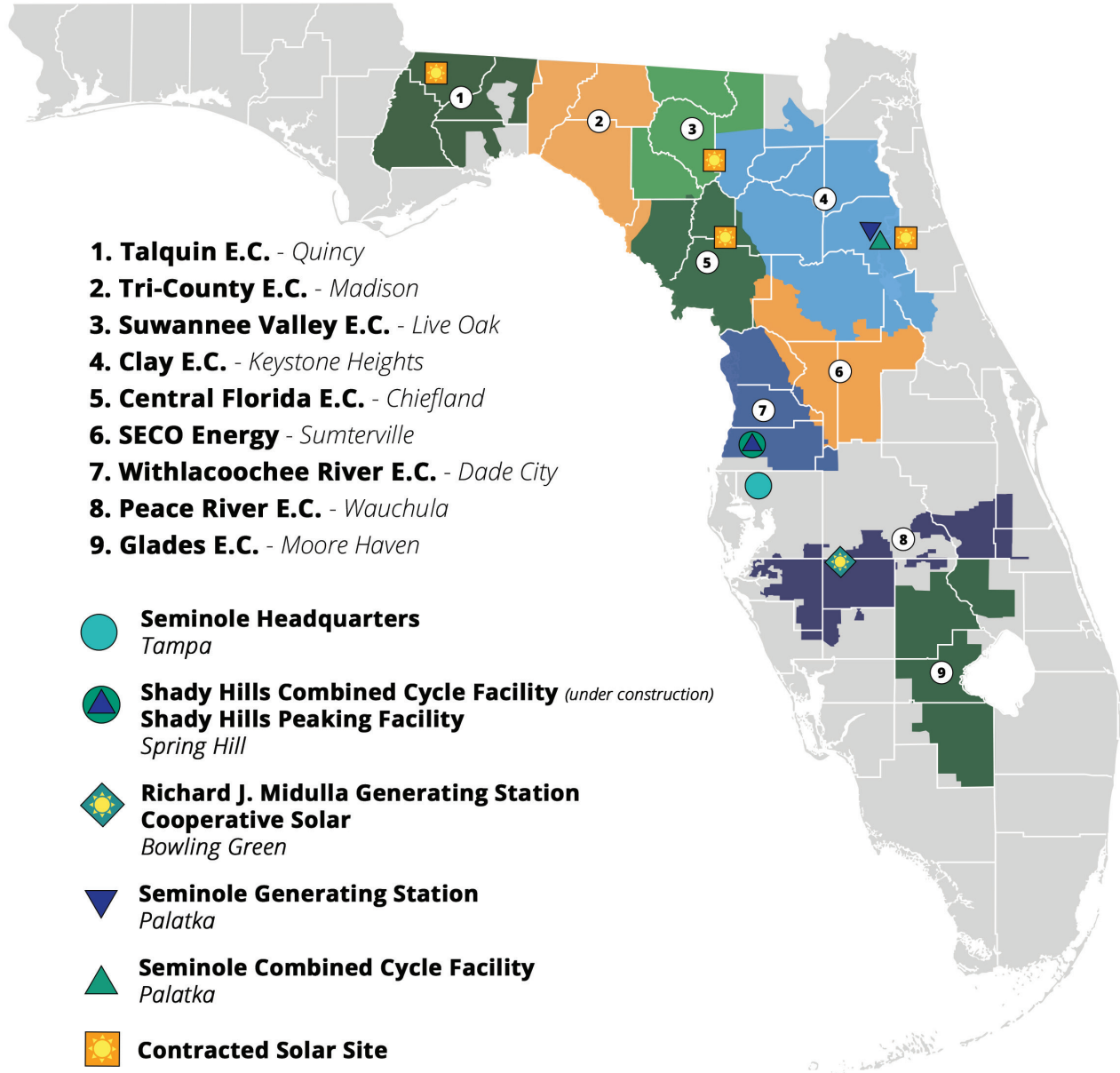
